PLANE CRASH TERROR AS KIDS FLEE

Pilot hailed hero for guiding doomed craft away from park

TWO AEROPLANES collided in mid-air, strewing debris and sending one crashing into Adur Recreation Ground where it burst into flames.

The pilot, Alan Weal, 63, died at the scene, but has been hailed a hero for guiding his doomed aircraft away from a children's play-ground, and on to the rec's open space.

The other plane managed to land safely at Shoreham Airport, despite

being severely damaged.

Shoreham town centre and the A27 turn-off at Steyning were brought to a virtual standstill following the incident, which happened about 4.30pm on Monday, as the A259 between the Salt Farm and Norfolk Bridge roundabouts was closed for more than three hours, and traffic diverted.
